**Social skills and competences**

After providing teaching assistance to several courses of statistics and econometrics during the period 1989-1997 I taught undergraduate courses in Introductory Econometrics, Econometrics and Program Evaluation, both at the Facoltà di Scienze Statistiche and at the School of Economics and Business Administration, University of Padova, covering all the topics of classic econometrics and modern micro-econometrics. I'm currently teaching a course of Statistics at the undergraduate students of the School of Economics and Business Administration and a course of Program Evaluation at the graduate students of the same School. I taught Structural Modelling in the Social Sciences at the doctoral program in Statistics, Dept. of Statistics, University of Padova. I supervised several students working at their dissertation at the same doctoral program. I also taught selected topics in micro-econometrics at the Consorzio Italiano di Econometria School for doctoral students.

As for research interests, after some working on measurement errors in national accounts and on their impact on the estimation of macro-econometric models while working at, and immediately

after, my graduation thesis, I switched to micro-econometrics working with qualitative and limited dependent variable models. In particular, at the time of my doctoral dissertation I worked on the modelling of female labour supply in Italy in the presence of institutional constraints on the working week length. My main current research interest is in program evaluation within the more general issue of drawing inferences from non-randomly selected samples. Over the last years I did my research on both methodological issues (in particular, deriving new results on the Regression Discontinuity Design) and case studies (in particular, the evaluation of public interventions in the field of labor and education).
